





Crafts week 14

Items in every day life

At home, you can find all kinds of normal, strange, beautiful and ugly objects for different every day tasks and purposes. Everything at home was invented, designed and made by someone. The object or item can be, for example, a plate, a toy, an item of clothing, a piece of furniture, a tool, a telephone, a book, a shoe, curtains, a bottle of juice or a vacuum. Before the object as been made, for example, by hand or in a factory, some consideration has been put into the following things: what it's needed for, its purpose, style, feeling, pleasantness, user experience, functionality, durability, and recycling. The point of this exercise is to consider what kinds of objects can be found at home, and for what kinds of purposes they are required.

- 1. Choose a task, and draw a picture of that task. If the list does not contain an appropriate task, invent one yourself.
- 2. Find objects that are suited to that task at home. If appropriate things cannot be found, you can also imagine them.
- 3. On a piece of paper, draw the task you chose. Things to consider:
- Objects required for the task
- The place / environment/ background, where the task is taking place
- The feeling (e.g., peaceful, busy, excited, happy)
- Plan the layout of the picture. Is it a close-up of the objects, or is it a depiction of a scene where you can see people performing the tasks.
